As a socially-engaged artist, Sale brings together often opposed constituencies of the criminal justice system from incarcerated men and women, to survivors/victims and their families, to correctional officers and elected officials, to community members, media, and activists. Sale is currently producing *Future IDs: reframing the narrative of re-entry*, a workshop series and artbased public service campaign, with the Los Angeles-based Anti-Recidivism Coalition.
